Philip Morris International Inc. (the Company) is hereby registering under this registration statement on Form S-8 (the Registration Statement) an aggregate of 30,000,000 shares of its common stock, without par value (Common Stock), authorized for issuance pursuant to the Philip Morris International Inc. 2012 Performance Incentive Plan that was approved by the Company s stockholders on May 9, 2012.

Any statement contained in a document incorporated by reference herein shall be deemed to be modified or superseded for purposes of the Registration Statement to the extent that a statement contained herein or in any other subsequently filed document that is incorporated by reference herein modifies or supersedes such earlier statement. Any such statement so modified or superseded shall not be deemed, except as so modified or superseded, to constitute a part of the Registration Statement.

Item 6. Indemnification of Directors and Officers.

The Virginia Stock Corporation Act (the VSCA) permits the Company to indemnify its officers and directors in connection with certain actions, suits and proceedings brought against them if they acted in good faith and believed their conduct to be in the best interests of the Company and, in the case of criminal actions, had no reasonable cause to believe that the conduct was unlawful. The VSCA requires such indemnification when a director entirely prevails in the defense of any proceeding to which he was a party because he is or was a director of the Company, and further provides that the Company may make any other or further indemnity (including indemnity with respect to a proceeding by or in the right of the Company), and may make additional provision for advances and reimbursement of expenses, if authorized by its articles of incorporation or stockholder-adopted by-laws, except an indemnity against willful misconduct or a knowing violation of the criminal law.

The VSCA establishes a statutory limit on liability of officers and directors of the Company for damages assessed against them in a suit brought by or in the right of the Company or brought by or on behalf of stockholders of the Company and authorizes the Company, with stockholder approval, to specify a lower monetary limit on liability in the Company s articles of incorporation or by-laws; however, the liability of an officer or director engaged in willful misconduct or a knowing violation of the criminal law or of any federal or state securities law. The Company s Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation (the Articles of Incorporation) provide that an officer or director or former officer or director of the Company shall be indemnified to the full extent permitted by the VSCA as currently in effect or as hereafter amended in connection with any action, suit or proceeding brought by or in the right of the Company or brought by or on behalf of stockholders of the Company. The Articles of Incorporation further provide for the limitation or elimination of the liability of an officer or director or former officer or director of the Company for monetary damages to the Company or its stockholders in any action, suit or proceeding, to the full extent permitted by the VSCA as currently in effect or as hereafter amended by the VSCA as currently in effect or as hereafter amended by the VSCA as currently in effect or as hereafter amended in connection with any action, suit or proceeding brought by or in the right of the Company or brought by or an officer or director or former officer or director of the Company for monetary damages to the Company or its stockholders in any action, suit or proceeding, to the full extent permitted by the VSCA as currently in effect or as hereafter amended. The Company carries insurance on behalf of its directors and officers.

The Company has entered into an indemnity agreement with each of the members of its Board of Directors (the Board) and each of its executive officers. The agreement provides for the mandatory indemnification against liabilities as well as mandatory advancement and reimbursement of all reasonable expenses (in each case subject to limited exceptions) that may be incurred by members of the Board and executive officers in various legal proceedings arising out of their service as directors and executive officers, as permitted by Virginia law and the Articles of Incorporation.
